Kerala set to host Global Science Festival

Festival of Kerala (GSFK) starting January 15, promising an extraordinary blend of scientific exploration and artistic brilliance.

Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan will inaugurate this unique event at the Bio 360 Life Sciences Park on January 15th at 06:00 pm, marking the beginning of a monthlong journey into the realms of scientific discoveries and creative innovations.

Covering an impressive 2.5 lakh square feet area, this specially curated science exhibition stands as an unprecedented venture in Asia. It's a collaboration between the Department of Science and Technology, Kerala State Council for Science, Technology, and Environment (KSCSTE), and Amuseum ArtScience, a non-profit public trust, bridging the worlds of science and art, offering visitors an enlightening experience under the theme of 'Life Science.' This festival promises a fusion of artistry and cutting-edge technologies like augmented reality (AR) and virtual reality (VR) through a myriad of interactive exhibits.

Tickets for the Global Science Festival of Kerala are priced at Rs 250 for adults and Rs 150 for those under 18. Two-day tickets are also available, costing Rs 400 and Rs 250 for adults and under 18 respectively.

Entry is complimentary for differently-abled individuals and children below 10 years. School groups of over 30 students can avail tickets at Rs 100 per person.

There are also tickets

available for students with meal options. There will be separate ticketing for some special pavilions where there are technical limitations on the maximum number of

Advance ticket bookings can be made on the website www. gsfk.org. Tickets can also be availed through Federal Bank who serves as the banking partner of GSFK. Actor Ms. Manju Warrier will kick start the ticket sales on January 1.

The festival will witness many discussions and public lectures. Prof. Morten P. Meldal, Nobel laureate in

a speech. U.S. Consulate General Chennai is facilitating a NASA-JPL Lecture Series at the Global Science Festival of Kerala - the first of its kind in Kerala where NASA scientists will deliver lectures.

With an anticipated audience of over ten lakh visitors from Kerala and beyond, the festival offers parking for approximately 500 vehicles and will arrange bus transportation from major centres to the festival complex.

Under the patronage of the Chief Minister and chaired Finance Minister K. N. Balagopal, the festival's activities are overseen by an organising committee led by Dr. K P Sudheer, Ex-Officio Principal Secretary of Science and Technology Department.

Renowned science populariser and teacher, Dr. Vaisakhan Thampi, curates the content of the festival, while sculptor Lakshmanan Komathmanalath and more than thirty artists craft the exhibits. Amuseum Artscience is a non-profit NGO for the popularization of Art and Science, based at Thiruvananthapuram.


